Current Voice Teaching Employment

My home studio is kept deliberately small with just a handful of students at a time. I work with skill levels of beginners to advanced singers, usually adults. I work for a set time frame on specific, collaboratively identified goals, often helping singers overcome a presenting problem. Within my home studio clients, I work with classical, jazz singers, contemporary and musical theatre.

Historically I teach a caseload of between 11 and 14 students at Eltham, and 11-12 students at Catherine McAuley, ranging from grade 5 to VCE. My VCE students have always attained excellent practical results and I receive many compliments from accompanists regarding how thoroughly my students know their pieces when they perform.

I have students who choose to engage with AMEB Musical Theatre Grade exams or AMEB Singing Grade exams. Others express the desire to improve is a motivator rather than exams; we work at improving by setting goals and working through new challenges, recognizing and acknowledging skill acquisition and growth as it occurs.

I encourage all students to engage with performance opportunities within the school. For students who struggle with confidence, I create lower-stakes



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opportunities (e.g., performing in a closed auditorium to only me, lunchtime concerts with only other singing students attending, simply going to a different room and emulating a performance by entering without speaking etc.,).

I have a passion for classical, jazz, contemporary and musical theatre. Logically and sequentially addressing the performance practice challenges of these differing genres (including pronunciation of Italian, French, and German) as well as the required underlying singing technique is a wonderfully enjoyable focus of lessons.

This role involves overseeing all musical offerings at official college events (sacred music at liturgies, entertainment at official celebrations, alumni concerts etc.,). I direct, conduct and arrange music for the St Mary's College Choir.


